When people are facing a crisis in life, a personal or family need or are at their most vulnerable, the social ministries of Saint Elizabeth respond with care and compassion, ready to serve and love our neighbor. Parish Outreach is available to provide assistance with food, referrals, school supplies, food and gifts for Thanksgiving and Christmas.





Family Program

The parish community of Saint Elizabeth commits to supporting young families on their journey to learn about God, what it means to be an active Catholic and how we serve one another, especially the poor and those who need us most.

Providing for the spiritual growth of our children is central to our Family Program. Each class session begins with prayer - parents and children together. Children then study with a trained Catechist in grade-level classes, while parents are updated in the essentials of the faith with their own qualified instructors.

First Communion

During the second year of a child's faith formation, they are

prepared to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist for the first time. Our First Communion masses are celebrated at weekend liturgies in May and are a joyful time for the children, their families and the parish.

The Confirmation Program

LIVING OUR FAITH AS DISCIPLES OF CHRIST: MASS, CLASS & SERVICE. Preparation for the reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation begins in grade 7 and ends with the reception of Confirmation in grade 9.

Seventh and Eighth grade students gather on Thursday evenings, October through April, for prayer and time with their peers to learn about the Bible, Catholic Church teaching and prayer. Our catechists are fellow parishioners who have volunteered their time and talent to pass on the faith to the next generation of our parish.

We are committed to preparing our young people to receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit, and strengthen them with the riches of our Catholic faith which will serve them for the rest of their lives.

Youth Ministry

Saint Elizabeth's youth ministry is a community of young people and future leaders growing and sharing their Catholic faith through prayer, service and fellowship. We encourage young members of our parish to come together to nurture their faith with one another. This year our youth ministry hosted a Diocesan Youth Rally, held a Vacation Bible Camp and gave back to the community with Teens at H.O.M.E. (Hands On Merciful Experiences.)
